¹The public health training centers and preventive medicine programs did not receive a transfer from the Prevention and Public Health Fund (PPHF) in FY 2013 or FY 2014; however, the programs received a \$25 million transfer from the PPHF in FY 2012 and a \$20 million transfer from the PPHF in FY 2011.

²Since FY 2011, the Oral Health Training line has included funding for state dental health improvement grants under §340G of the Public Health Service Act. The programs previously were funded under Allied Health.

³The FY 2012 figures in this table reflect a 0.189 percent rescission applied to most Labor-HHS-Education programs in P.L. 112-74.

⁴The FY 2012 total for the mental and behavioral health program included a \$10 million transfer from the Prevention and Public Health Fund; however the programs did not receive a transfer in FYs 2013-14.

⁵The FY 2013 figures in this table are from HRSA's FY 2013 Sequestration Operating Plan, updated in late-May; they reflect rescissions included in Division F, Title V of the Continuing Appropriations Act (P.L. 113-6), cuts as required under sequestration by the Budget Control Act (P.L. 112-25) and the American Taxpayer Relief Act (P.L. 112-240), as well as additional transfers within the Department of Health and Human Services.

⁶The FY 2012 total for geriatrics programs included a \$2 million transfer from the PPHF Alzheimer's Fund, and the FY 2013 total includes a \$1.847 million transfer from the Fund. The programs did not receive a transfer in FY 2014.

⁷The President's FY 2015 budget proposes to fund the Advanced Education Nursing program through the Public Health Service (PHS) evaluation tap.
